

# FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH



This project involved a general renovation of the existing Sanctuary and Chapel spaces and included an expansion of the chancel areas to provide additional space for the Church's growing music program.

In the Sanctuary, pictured here, dual projection screens rise up in unison from above the doorways for display of video and computer sources. The video projectors are integrated into secured vented enclosures at the balcony level. To serve the choir, three flat panel displays rise up in unison from the rail just in front of the choir. Control of these systems is from an open operating location at the balcony.

The sound reinforcement systems allow for automatic or manual operation depending on the requirements of the particular service or event. In the Sanctuary, the loudspeakers are hidden behind architectural medallions to maintain the clean traditional look desired by the Church.

CFA's services for this project included detailed design and commissioning of the audio-visual and sound reinforcement systems.
